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

Turkish cuisine is one of the top three cuisines of the world thanks to the variety of its recipes, natural ingredients, flavours and its influence throughout Europe, Asia, the Middle East and Africa. It may be said that Turkish cuisine, in a sense, is a bridge between far-Eastern and Mediterranean cuisines. The emphasis is always on the natural taste and flavour of the ingredients. Main courses are usually served with a side dish of rice. Meat and fish

restaurants are plentiful in Ankara and due to its strategic location, Ankara is blessed with a wide variety of daily fish flown in from all parts of the country.

Turkish dinners are rather long, the food is plenty and enjoyed in the company of friends with passionate conversations carrying on into the night. Turks are also fond of casseroles and stews so you can find many restaurants offering these. After dinner, the fresh fruit or dessert served is usually with compliments of the restaurant, unless they have a dessert menu. Desserts here are extra sweet like the baklava, kadayıf and muhallebi, only to name a few. Türk kahvesi, Turkish coffee, is served in small cups and you can choose how much sugar you like in it. Turkish coffee is a big part of the culture and considering it was the Turks who introduced coffee to Europe, they are right to be fond of their Turkish coffee.

# Esenboğa International Airport



Ankara Esenboga Airport is located approximately 33 kilometers north of Ankara. Havaş, airport buses and shuttles, run regularly to and from the

city. The buses for the city centre depart from the airport approximately 25 minutes after landing and do generally not operate between 9.30pm-3am, depending on their final stop. They have two stops in the city, one near the stadium and one in Asti Bus Terminal, which is located further away.

There are also public city buses, Ego, running to and from the airport. The buses leave right outside the arrivals floor, in both the Domestic Terminal and International Terminal.

Taxis are another option and they are available 24 hours every day. Car rental and parking are available at the airport.

### **Public Transport**



In Ankara there are many means of transport, which are both cheap and easy. Asti Bus Terminal is the main bus terminal, here you can take the bus to

any destination within the country and it is located about 5 kilometres southwest of the city centre.




