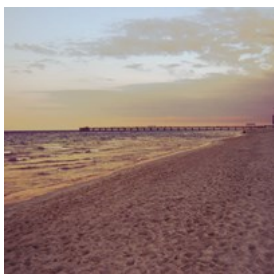
Flamingo Gardens

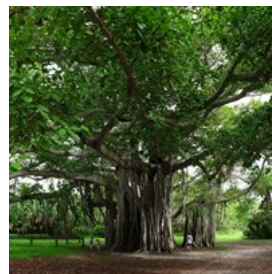
Jungle Queen Cruises
