

Founded in 1838, Kansas City played a crucial role in western expansion, as well as a center-point for trade and commerce. This development led to Kansas City becoming the sublime metropolitan city it is today.

This city served as the hub of innovation and expansion for famous and beloved individuals. Walt Disney's first animations were created in Kansas City, where his Laugh-O-Gram Studio is located. 
