



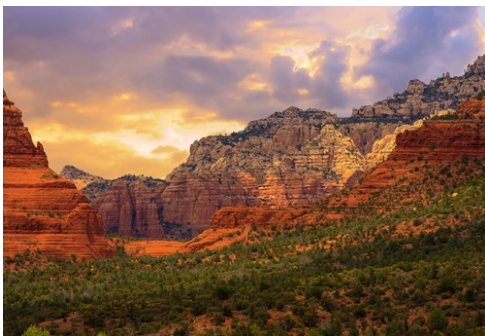

THE CITY

The sunrise and sunset have formed an inseparable bond with Sedona: the city's sandstone formations cavort with the sunlight in an unforgettable manner—the result of which leads to numerous photograph opportunities. Poets, writers, thinkers, lovers, scientists, and countless others have either made Sedona their permanent residence, or a permanent spot on their vacation itineraries.

The love affair with Sedona dates back to early civilization. Paleo-Indians hunted big game in the area between 11500 and 9000 B.C., and prehistoric Archaic Indians hunted and gathered until 300 A.D. Rock art can still be found in areas around Sedona. The exceptionally creative Sinagua people entered Verde Valley following the Archaic Indians, leaving such art as pottery, basketry, and masonry behind. Their pueblos and cliff dwellings have remained in Montezuma Well, Honanki, Palatki, and Tuzigoot.

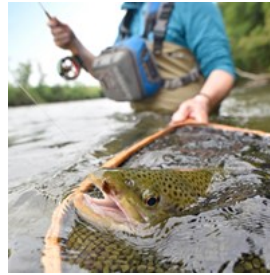

Out of Africa Wildlife Park

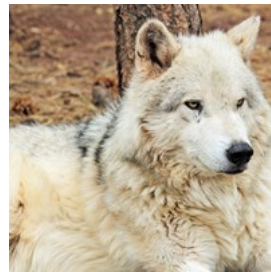


Founded in 1988 by Dean and Prayeri Harrison, Out of Africa Wildlife Park is the perfect family outing. There are daily shows and an African Bush

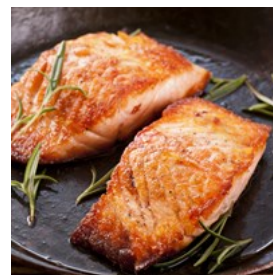

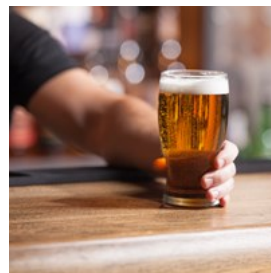

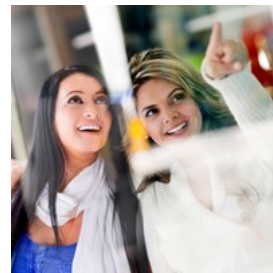

Passport/Visa



Citizens of the Schengen countries, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Japan, South Korea,

Taiwan and the Kingdom of Brunei can visit the United States for up to 90 days without applying for a visa (as well as citizens of Andorra, Lichtenstein, Monaco and San Marino). Citizens of these countries must obtain an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before traveling. All other travelers must obtain a visa before visiting the United States. International travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the country.
