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THE CITY

Welcome to Annecy, the jewel of the Haute-Savoie department. Between lake and mountains, between Italy and Switzerland, this city is blessed by a luxurious nature and bathed by a romantic light.

The medieval streets and arcades of the old town will let you feel like walking around in a fairy tale. Even if it was founded in the Prehistoric times and expanded by the Romans, the asset we know today is mostly due to the influence of the Dukes of Savoy, from the 15th century. Annecy was also a centre of the Calvinist counter-Reform which lead the Catholic Church to increase its presence in the city: as a result, several churches were built and a monastery was founded.

The Sardinian period, in the 19th century, led Annecy to its industrial revolution: a lot of factories were created, such as paper and clothing industries. Taken by France in 1860, the industrialisation kept on and the city started to become attractive to tourists.

Nowadays, Annecy is an influential city, turned mostly towards tourism and culture: the International Film Festival for Animation and the International Film Festival for Italian Movies are organised each year and attract thousands of visitors.

Palais de l'Île




The Palais de l'Isle is probably the most famous building in Annecy and, without any doubts, one of the most photographed sights in France. The

Lovers' Bridge



Legend says that if two persons kiss on the middle of the bridge, their love will be eternal. Created around 1906 to replace another bridge,

Pont des Amours (the Lovers' Bridge) links the European Gardens to the Pâquier park. It offers a really beautiful view: on one side, you can see the lake and on the other side, the old town can be pictured.

Jardins de l'Europe




Around 250 trees, such as a tulip tree, pines and giant sequoia trees, are found in the lovely Gardens of Europe, where you can enjoy a

walk by the lake in a sunny afternoon. This romantic English garden, designed by Henri Porreaux in 1863, is a heavenly spot in town where children are free to play from a walking distance to the old town, while you sit on one of the benches in front of the lake.

Basilica of the Visitation



Dominating the city, this cathedral symbolises the rich religious past of the city and gives an indirect insight of the muted power struggle between

Calvinism and Catholism. The Visitation Basilica protects the bodies of Saint Joan of Chantal and Saint Francis of Sales, as well as a 38-ton chime, named Marie-Françoise.

Europe, the "Fête du lac", which includes 70 minutes of fireworks in rhythm with music, lights and special effects over the lake. Basically, an unmissable experience.



Eglise Saint-François de Sales



The Saint-Francis of Sales Church, listed as a historical monument, is located near the Palais de l'Île, across the Thiou river. Even if the facade

seems a bit austere, the interior of the church is luxurious: the baroque style exposes its splendour with an organ, paintings and a magnificent altar. This church used to host religious relics, such as the graves of Saint Francis and Saint Joan of Chantal, which were there before being transported to the Visitation Basilica.

Passport/Visa



France can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens of Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel, UAE and

most countries in America. If you are unsure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend contacting the embassy or consulate in your country.

International (non-Schengen) travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the Schengen zone. Citizens of Schengen countries, instead, can travel without a passport, but must have a valid ID with them during their stay.

Best Time to Visit



No matter what time of the year you decide to visit this city, the "Venice of the Alps" will let you capture the beauty of its history and nature in

each season. Many towns close to Annecy house winter sports resorts and open their doors in winter, so if you're interested in coming to the region for skiing on the French side of the Alps, you should definitely choose the cold season. Otherwise, if cold and skiing are not your thing, consider planning your trip in spring: even if summer means the best days in terms of weather (also, the lake is at its warmest), it is also when tourism is at its peak, so you'd do better coming in spring to enjoy the city on foot and admire the beautiful flowers blooming all along the canals.

Annecy also has a bustling cultural scene, whose offer covers the whole year. The two main summer events are the Lake Festival (www.lac-a nnecy.com/fete-et-manifestation/1/209349-fete-d u-lac.html), a spectacular pyrotechnic show over the lake, and the International Animation Film Festival (www.annecy.org), held respectively in August and June. If you come in the fall season, don't miss the chance to see the "Déscente des Alpages": every year in October, farmers take their livestock down from the mountains to the streets of the centre, where a number of artisans and farmers display and sell their products, and folk bands play all day. Another popular occurrence is the Venetian Carnival, which is very similar to the one in Venice and takes place between February and March. Finally, also in winter, the iconic Annecy Christmas Market (www.marchedenoelannecv.com) in the old town, held between the end of November and the beginning of January, is a must-see for visitors,



who love to stroll along the canals in a magical atmosphere, and enjoy delicious local food or handicrafts.

Genève Aéroport



Annecy is served by Geneva Airport, situated less than 50 kilometres from the city centre. You can reach the airport, or travel from there to

Annecy in several ways.

The first option is renting a car. There are several car rental companies in the airport where you can rent one, but if you decide to return it to the French sector you may be asked to pay an additional fee (same thing happens if you rent a car in the French sector and you return it to the Swiss one). Some of the companies at the airport are Avis (www.avis.ch), Budget (www.budget.ch), Europear (www.europear.ch) and Hertz (www.hertz.ch). Here you find more information about car rental companies:

Buses also operate regularly to connect Geneva Airport to Annecy (as well as other French cities and winter sports resorts). If you search for a bus (www.gva.ch/en/Portaldata/1/Resources/fichi ers/voyageurs/Cars_lignes_r_guli_res_GeneveAer oport.pdf), you will need to take a Transalis one (line T72), with many departures each day from the airport.

Otherwise, you can also take one of the regular trains departing from Geneva-Cornavin Station (in the city centre), which you can reach in 6

minutes with one of the trains departing (5 times per hour) from the airport. SNCF (www.voyages-sncf.com) is the company that manages the railway service.

Public Transport



SIBRA (www.sibra.fr)
runs the local transport
system and links, with an
efficient bus service, the
communes of the Grand
Annecy. Tickets

(www.sibra.fr/voyages-occasionnels) can be purchased from the stations, the tourist information office and in kiosks (www.sibra.fr/points-de-vente), and travel cards are also available in these shops. The Espace SIBRA (21 Rue de la Gare) is the main transport information office, it opens 6 days a week and is close to the SNCF station.

The same company also offer a bike rental service, called Vélonecy (www.sibra.fr/velonecy): more than 200 bikes can be rented and used to move around the city in the respect of the environment. You can choose between classic bikes, electric bikes and folding bikes (very quick to set up), and even if renting one daily, weekly or monthly, depending on how much you want to stay in Annecy (more information: www.velonecy.com / infos@velonecy.com).

An alternative to SIBRA to stroll around Annecy city centre is the rental company Roul'ma Poule (www.annecy-location-velo.com), with two shops (in Annecy and Annecy-le-Vieux). There you can rent not only bikes (classic, electric or tandem



bikes), but also rollers (www.annecy-location-vel o.com/en/roller-rental-annecy), kayaks (www.ann ecy-location-velo.com/en/kayak-paddle-rental-ann ecy-le-vieux) and paddle boards (www.annecy-loc ation-velo.com/en/paddle-boards-rental-annecy-le -vieux), for an amazing tour of the lake.
